



As mentioned in the previous bulletin, we would be forwarding several questions each week to help reflect on how we “walk together” as a Church.

In March, our parishes will be organising “listening sessions” to facilitate how individuals have experience living in the Church. This is not only for practicing Catholics, but also for those who are distant from the Church or those who live on the peripheries of our society.

As mentioned, we are currently putting together a team of “Listening Leaders” to facilitate these listening sessions, and preparing the training for them.

As of 1 February 2022, the Archdiocese of Edmonton has made available an on-line tool for individuals who wish to submit their experiences even prior to the parish listening sessions.

In order to focus your thoughts prior to actual participation, this week’s set of questions are as follows (they are also available by [clicking here](#)):

The key question is: How is this “journeying together” happening today in your local Church? What steps does the Holy Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our journeying together?

Specific themes and questions to think about this week:

1. COMPANIONS ON THE JOURNEY

In the Church and in society we are side by side on the same road.

In our local Church, who are the ones “journeying together”?

Who are our companions on the journey, including those outside the boundaries of the Church?

How are we called to grow as companions?

2. LISTENING

Listening is the first step, but it requires an open mind and heart, without prejudice.

How is God speaking to us through voices we sometimes ignore?

How are the laity listened to, especially women and young people?

What facilitates or inhibits our listening?

How do we integrate the contribution of Consecrated Men and Women?

What space is there for the voice of minorities, especially people who experience poverty, marginalization, or social exclusion?

What are some limitations in our ability to listen, especially to those who have different views than our own?

How do we listen to the social and cultural context in which we live?

How well do we listen to those on the peripheries?

3. SPEAKING OUT

All are invited to speak with courage and parrhesia, that is, in freedom, truth, and charity.

What enables or hinders speaking up courageously, candidly, and responsibly in our local Church and in society?

When and how do we manage to say what is important to us?

How does the relationship with the local media work (not only Catholic media)?

Who speaks on behalf of the Christian community, and how are they chosen?

4. CELEBRATION

“Walking together” is only possible if it is based on communal listening to the Word and the celebration of the Eucharist.

How do prayer and liturgical celebration inspire and direct our “journeying together”?

How do they inspire the most important decisions?

How do we promote the active participation of all the faithful in the liturgy?

What space is given to the exercise of the ministries of Lector and Acolyte?

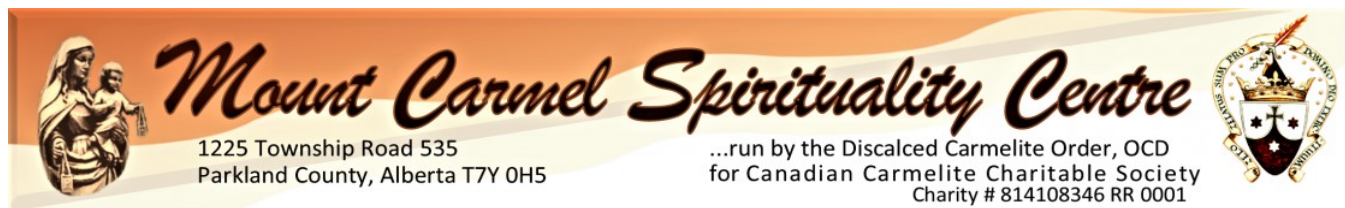
HEATING & INSURANCE COSTS

This winter, as with everyone else, our parishes are incurring significant increases in heating costs. As well, **insurance costs for each of our two buildings have soared 75% over last year** (this is true throughout all dioceses in western Canada)

During our recent cold snap, our heating bills are as follows:

Assumption Church: \$3130 (which includes a carbon tax of \$633, for the billing period 16 Dec. 2021 to 20 January 2022) ♦ **Resurrection Church:** \$1756 (which includes a carbon tax of \$350 for the billing period 11 Dec. 2021-14 Jan. 2022)

We will publish our 2021 Annual Report within the next two months.



Our Lady of Good Success Half-Day Retreat February 19, 2022

At the end of the 16th century, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to a Conceptionist nun in Quito, Ecuador under the title of Our Lady of Good Success. The nun she appeared to was called Mother Mariana de Jesus Torres. Mother Mariana was a Spanish Conceptionist sister who traveled from her country to the New World to help found the Royal Convent. Favoured with many singular gifts from heaven, this chosen soul was given to know many future events, especially the grievous situation of the Church in the 20th Century. Our Lady told her that in our lamentable times, heresies would abound, the corruption of the manners and customs would be almost complete, and the light of the Faith nearly extinguished. To atone for the many profanations, blasphemies and abuses and to hasten the day of the triumphant restoration this 17th century sister was asked to become an expiatory victim for our times.

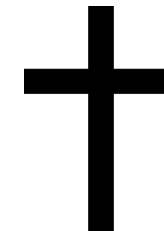
