



As mentioned in previous bulletins , we would be forwarding several questions each week to help reflect on how we “walk together” as a Church.

In March, our parishes will be organising “listening sessions” to facilitate how individuals have experience living in the Church. This is not only for practicing Catholics, but also for those who are distant from the Church or those who live on the peripheries of our society.

As mentioned, we are currently putting together a team of “Listening Leaders” to facilitate these listening sessions, and preparing the training for them.

As of 1 February 2022, the Archdiocese of Edmonton has made available an on-line tool for individuals who wish to submit their experiences even prior to the parish listening sessions: Visit <https://caedm.ca/synod>.

In order to focus your thoughts prior to actual participation, this week’s set of questions are as follows (they are also available by [clicking here](#)):

The key question is: How is this “journeying together” happening today in your local Church? What steps does the Holy Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our journeying together?

Specific themes and questions to think about this week:

5. CO-RESPONSIBLE IN THE MISSION

Synodality is at the service of the Church’s mission, in which all her members are called to participate.

- Since we are all missionary disciples, how is every baptized person called to participate in the mission of the Church?
- What hinders the baptized from being active in mission?
- What areas of mission are we neglecting?
- How does the community support its members who serve society in various ways (social and political involvement, scientific research, education, promoting social justice, protecting human rights, caring for the environment, etc.)?
- How does the Church help these members to live out their service to society in a missionary way?
- How is discernment about missionary choices made and by whom?
- How are the different traditions that constitute the patrimony of many Churches, especially the Oriental ones, integrated and adapted, with respect to the synodal style, in view of an effective Christian witness?
- How does collaboration work in territories where different Catholic ritual Churches are present (e.g. Ukranian Catholic, Syro-MalabarCatholic, Syro-Malanchar Catholic, Melchite and Marronite, etc.)?

6. DIALOGUE IN CHURCH AND SOCIETY

Dialogue is a path of perseverance that also includes silences and sufferings, but which is capable of gathering the experience of persons and peoples.

- What are the places and means of dialogue within our particular Church?
- How are divergences of vision, or conflicts and difficulties addressed?
- How do we promote collaboration with neighbouring dioceses, religious communities in the area, lay associations and movements, etc.?
- What particular issues in the Church and society do we need to pay more attention to?
- What experiences of dialogue and collaboration do we have with believers of other religions and with those who have no religious affiliation?
- How does the Church dialogue with and learn from other sectors of society: the spheres of politics, economics, culture, civil society, and people who live in poverty?

7. ECUMENISM

The dialogue between Christians of different denominations, united by one Baptism, has a special place in the Synodal journey.

- What relationships does our Church community have with members of other Christian traditions and denominations?
- What do we share and how do we journey together?
- What fruits have we drawn from this “journeying together”?
- What are the difficulties?
- How can we take the next step in walking forward with each other?

8. AUTHORITY AND PARTICIPATION

A synodal Church is a participatory and co-responsible Church.

- How does our Church community identify the goals to be pursued, the way to reach them, and the steps to be taken?
- How is authority or governance exercised within our particular Church (Diocese/Eparchy)?
- How are teamwork and co-responsibility put into practice?
- How are evaluations conducted and by whom?
- How are lay ministries and the responsibility of lay people promoted?
- Have we had fruitful experiences of synodality on a local level?
- How do synodal bodies function at the level of the particular Church (Pastoral Councils in parishes and dioceses, Presbyteral Council, etc.)?

Special Collection for Indigenous Peoples March 5 & 6, 12 & 13, 2022

We have all been impacted in some way as our nation undergoes an examination of our past relationships with its Indigenous Peoples. We cannot erase history, but we can look forward to—and help create—a better future.

As part of the journey towards healing and reconciliation, the Archdiocese of Edmonton has made a firm commitment to provide funds in support of programs and initiatives that respond to the various needs that exist among Indigenous Peoples in our local area.

This is part of a national effort announced by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Bishops of Canada have made a \$30-million collective financial commitment to support healing and reconciliation initiatives among Indigenous Peoples. The Archdiocese and its parishes will contribute three million dollars toward the national goal, using funds that we have been able to designate and set aside for this purpose.

In addition, since many people have expressed their desire to make a personal contribution towards this effort, there will be two special parish collections on the weekends of March 5-6 and March 12-13, 2022. 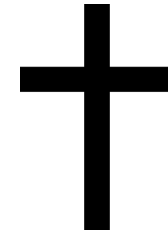
