

What is your bucket list? What are all the things that you still hope to achieve?

If we have no hope in the Resurrection, what would our bucket list look like? Experience as much as possible? Travel as much as possible? Get out of this life what I have not yet been able to get?

What is the bucket list of the child huddling below the rubble of Mariupol, Ukraine? What is the bucket list of the mother straining under eleven years of civil war in Aleppo, Syria? The father in the Tigray region of Ethiopia? It should not escape our notice that all these lands are carriers of ancient civilisation and regions of early Christianity; the Cross of Christ is not absent from them.

What was Christ's bucket list as he approached Calvary carrying the Cross of our fallen world? What did he yet hope to achieve? I think we can say that his bucket list was the same at the end of his earthly sojourn as it was at the beginning of it: he came into the world to love, and he loved us to the end (John 13:1). The Resurrection tells us there is one thing that does not end with death, and that is love. We simply swap out one form of love for another: an earthly love circumscribed by the limits of the globe swapped out for a participation in God's own love which knows no limits, not even the Cross, not even death itself.

Is there a bucket list for love?

The bucket list of love is to root out all hate, for hate is a corrupted form of love which sees in my neighbour only an enemy to be vanquished or a tool for my blind self-satisfaction.

"Even if through Easter, Christ has destroyed the root of evil, he still wants the assistance of men and women in every time and place who help him affirm his victory using his own weapons: the weapons of justice and truth, mercy, forgiveness and love" (Benedict XVI).

The Resurrection of Jesus is not a myth or a dream, it is not a vision or a utopia, it is not a fairy tale, but is a singular, unrepeatable event: Jesus of Nazareth, son of Mary, who at dusk on Friday was taken down from the Cross and buried, has victoriously left the tomb. The physical tomb of death, yes, but the tomb of all hatred and selfishness, the tomb of injustice and falsity, the tomb of materialism and nihilism, the tomb of every vision of life that is unable to move beyond the self which has become enclosed upon itself, the tomb of every vision of a creation circumscribed by the limits of earthly life.

What is our bucket list this Easter? How has the Resurrection of Our Lord changed that list? How has Love transformed it?

The resurrection of the Lord is our hope

Infant Jesus and St. Kateri Half-Day Retreat May 7th, 2022

The devotion to the **Infant Jesus** has long been a tradition of the Catholic Church. This devotion is a veneration of our Lord's sacred infancy. Many saints had a very strong devotion to the Divine Child.

St. Kateri Tekakwitha was born in 1656 in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon. She contracted smallpox as a four-year-old child which scarred her skin. Kateri was known as a skilled worker, who was diligent and patient.

However, she refused to marry. At age 19, Kateri converted to Catholicism, taking a vow of chastity and pledging to marry only Jesus Christ which was unpopular in her community.


