

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

June 12, 2022



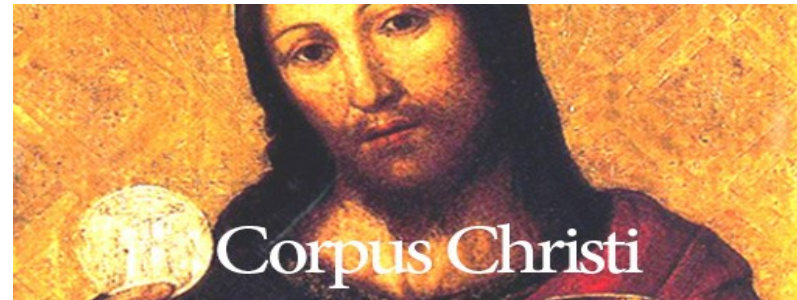
Holy Trinity Sunday is celebrated on the first Sunday following Pentecost in most of the liturgical churches in Western Christianity. It is a solemn celebration of the belief in the revelation of one God, yet three divine persons. It was not uniquely celebrated in the early church, but as with many things the advent of new, sometimes heretical, thinking often gives the Church a moment in which to explain and celebrate its own traditions; things it already believes and holds dear. In the early 4th century when the Arian heresy was spreading, the early church, recognizing the inherent Christological and Trinitarian implications, prepared an Office of Prayer with canticles, responses, a preface and hymns, to be recited on Sundays to proclaim the Holy Trinity. Pope John XXII (14th century) instituted the

celebration as a feast for the entire Church; the celebration became a solemnity after the liturgical reforms of Vatican II.

Feast of Corpus Christi

June 19, 2022



In 1263 a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague was having doubts about Jesus being truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. Certain theologians were introducing doubts about the Body and Blood of Christ being present in the consecrated bread and wine. In response to his doubt, when he recited the prayer of consecration during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, blood started seeping from the consecrated host and onto the corporal.

Fr. Peter reported this miracle to Pope Urban IV, who at the time was in Orvieto. The pope sent delegates to investigate and ordered that host and blood-stained corporal be brought to Orvieto. The relics were placed in the Cathedral of Orvieto, where they remain to this day. This Eucharistic Miracle confirmed the visions given to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon a nun and mystic who had a series of visions who was instructed by Our Lord to establish a feast for the Holy Eucharist.

After many years she finally convinced Pope Urban IV, to create this special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. After her death, Pope Urban instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle in Bolsena. Pope Urban then commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass and Office for the feast of Corpus Christi. Aquinas' hymns in honour of the Holy Eucharist, *Pange Lingua*, *Tantum Ergo*, *Panis Angelicus*, and *O Salutaris Hostia* are the beloved hymns the Church sings on the feast of Corpus Christi as well as throughout the year during Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

PAPAL VISIT DONATIONS

We are delighted to share the joy of the upcoming pastoral visit by Pope Francis to Canada on July 24—29, 2022. This visit will be one of healing, hope and reconciliation that we hope will be a watershed moment for the Indigenous Peoples of this land and the Church’s relationship with them.

The Vatican has confirmed that the Holy Father will utilize three hubs for the visit to Canada: Edmonton, Quebec City and Iqaluit. It will be a much more modest visit than a usual papal pilgrimage, due to the Holy Father’s age, health and mobility.

Still, there are costs associated with the visit, including lodging and event security, event production costs and site logistics. National organizers estimate the total cost of the visit at \$15 million, and are working to secure support from all levels of government as well as the private sector.

There will be two pew collections within the Archdiocese of Edmonton to help with these costs. The first will be June 18-19, prior to National Indigenous Peoples Day on June 21. The second collection will be July 23-24. Pope Francis arrives in Canada on July 24.

June 12 - Most Holy Trinity

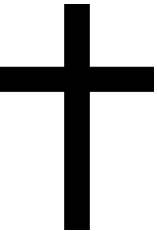
